

A Driver's Guide To Dropping Off And Picking Up Students at CYES

Schools are active centers of learning and discovery. As students learn, we need to keep them safe and also teach them about safety. Safety measures begin as the students arrive at school each morning, are maintained during the day, and continue as students depart in the afternoon.

Vehicular traffic around a school can pose a safety problem, especially at the beginning and end of the school day. The flow of traffic created by private cars dropping off and picking up children, commuters passing the school, and school buses converging create potential hazards to students.

KISS & RIDE AREA

CYES has designated an area called Kiss and Ride designed as a safe place for adults in private vehicles to load and discharge children. This separate lane enables school staff to avoid problems associated with cars passing buses, or parking in bus only zones and fire lanes.

The Kiss & Ride area has several important features:

- Adult supervision is provided by school staff members.
- Private-vehicle traffic can move faster and safer since the vehicles are not in the same driveway as school buses.
- Students are housed inside the building under adult supervision until their car arrives. They are escorted with adults to be loaded into waiting cars.
- Cars do not park in the Kiss & Ride lane, allowing for a smooth drop off and pick up.



KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE

In order to ensure the safety of all children, the following rules need to be observed. If all drivers cooperate, the adult supervisors will be able to provide an efficient and safe transfer of children.

- Load and discharge children only in the Kiss and Ride area.
- Pull your car as far forward as possible in the loading zone (marked by the white diagonal lines) before stopping to load or discharge children. Five or six cars can transfer students at the same time.
- Load and discharge children from the passenger side of the car only.
- Remain in the driver's seat. If needed, adults will assist with car doors.
- Keep goodbyes brief: other drivers will be waiting behind you to discharge children.
- Do not pass other cars that are loading or discharging children.
- Exit the Kiss & Ride promptly after loading or discharging children. When picking up children, pull into the Kiss & Ride area and wait in your car.

SAVING TIME

You can save time by planning ahead. Here are a few suggestions:

- Adjust for rain. The number of cars using the Kiss & Ride area will increase when it rains. Be patient, and plan on spending a small amount of additional time.
- Carpool with others. Carpools reduce the number of vehicles using the Kiss & Ride area, thus saving time. Inform CYES of your carpool plans so school officials will know which adults will be transporting which children.



EXCEPTIONS

There are a few times when you would not use the Kiss & Ride area:

 If you must leave your car to enter the school, leave your vehicle in a parking space while you do so.
